Auction Meeting Help:

Oct. 5th is our Annual Auction meeting. Row Kowalski has been organizing this with help from our Ch. 121 friends. Ron has provided a listing of positions that need to be filled.

In the past years, we have relied on major help from our Chapter 121 friends, but we should try to be more self sufficient as the host Chapter if we can.

The following is a listing of the **Auction Staffing Positions** that we need to cover:

- ♦ <u>Assignor</u>: Assigns an auction number to each item and writes a brief description as given by the seller. (example—Ansonia, Shelf Clock, Working) Collects \$1 per item.
- ♦ <u>Arranger:</u> Makes sure that all items are arranged in numberical order for the auctioneer.
- ♦ <u>Presenters</u>: Take items from table and hold up while auctioneer sells them. (Two persons required alternating items).
- ♦ <u>Auctioneer:</u> Two persons required. Second person gives auctioneer a break.
- Recorder: Records the selling price and the number of the buyer.
- ◆ Paddle Seller: Sells bidding paddles for \$2 each, and records the name of paddle buyer.

While not part of the actual auction, we also need a <u>50:50 Raffle ticket seller</u>. This is a very import part of our meetings, since it helps pay for the meeting room.
