## Chapter 50, IRS Status Report

Many of you will remember the discussions at our meetings about Chapter 50's attempts to be granted a 501c7 non-profit status. During 2013, we submitted all necessary documents to National to be included in their group application. National did submit our application, and we were granted the 501c7 status in September 2013. In December 2013, the IRS revoked our status — due to our not having filed 501c7 returns for the past 3 years! This same thing has happened to many of the other Chapters that National had included in their application.

Our Treasurer, Ron Kowalski, has spent much effort to try to get our status reinstated. He has had discussions with the IRS, with Steve Humphrey, our National Executive Director, and has filled out over 20 pages of forms. He has re-submitted all this information, and has reasonable hope that this application will be accepted.

Expect to have some discussion of how all this affects our bank accounts at our next meeting.
