# July Meeting Report

Our National Director, Chet Ekstrand, gave a report on the recent National Convention, held in Milwaukee, WI, June 17—21st. Chet said that it was a

There were about 1100 people registered, and about 850 tables sold, although only about 550 were occupied. It is unknown why so many were unoccupied, although severe weather in the Eastern US may have kept many table holders away.

Chet reported that Chapter 50 member, Phil Johansen, had received a double gold medal for the spectacular long duration clock he had entered in the Crafts Competition. Phil was very gracious when recognized with a round of applause. He said that he was blown away by another entry. It was an astronomical clock made entirely from LEGOs! It was accurate to 1 minute per day and included many astronomical complications. This should certainly appeal to the next generation of horologists as well!

The meeting was concluded with the Drawing for the 50:50 raffle. The holder of the lucky winning ticket was Danny Chien, who received a payout of \$74! Congratulations!

The meeting was adjourned and we moved on to the program.

by the Keystone Watch Case Company in 1903. They then began to make and market their watches under the Howard name. These were complete watches, cased at the factory.

The advertisements in this series were of a hand drawn scene of an elegant gentleman with a watch in some circumstance. The text went on to state that the man with a Howard had the best possible watch for whatever he would encounter.

Hans has accumulated a wonderful collection of these original advertisements — it may be that he has bought up the entire supply, since he says that they very rarely come up for sale now.....



Writing on clock works indicates built in 1801. I think it is American made. Came from West Virginia. Clock is 91 inches tall, about 21 inches wide and 13 inches deep. The glass is missing. It has an alarm feature, the small brass dial around the center of the hands is to set the alarm. I had a clock guy check it out, it is worn, but works fine. I would like to get \$1000.00 for it. The finish is lighter than it photographed. Clock is in Sequim, Wa.
